

# Accessibility

## Migros Museum für Gegenwartskunst

The equal and barrier-free participation in the exhibitions, the event program as well as the art education program of the Migros Museum für Gegenwartskunst is a matter of concern to us. In this document you will find detailed information about the current accessibility of the museum and the concrete measures that have been taken for an equal experience of the current exhibition „Interdependencies: Perspectives on Care and Resilience“. We also inform you about remaining barriers that the Migros Museum für Gegenwartskunst would like to gradually remove in the future.

### Travel and access to the Migros Museum für Gegenwartskunst

Barrier-free access to the museum for people with limited mobility, wheelchairs and strollers is ensured by means of an elevator. Likewise, all exhibition levels can be reached via an elevator. The glass doors at the entrance to the building are marked with appropriate security markings. There are no glass doors in the museum itself.

A gender-neutral wheelchair restroom is located on the 1st basement level and is accessible via the elevator.

Assistance dogs are welcome in the exhibition.

### Arrival and information about current exhibitions

We provide one wheelchair for people with limited mobility. Please contact the visitor service at the entrance of the museum.

In the entrance area of the museum, we provide the visitor text, which gives information about the current exhibition, in different versions. The text is available in German and English, as well as in plain language in German and English, and also in the form of a sign language video. In addition, an introductory text about the exhibition can be listened to via an audio guide. The texts can be viewed and saved with your own mobile device via a QR code.

The accompanying scripts for the exhibition's video works are available in German at the reception. We also provide the information texts about the individual artworks as handouts in large print at the box office. These can be taken into the exhibition.

## Visit the current exhibition

An elevator in the exhibition area provides barrier-free access to all levels for people with limited mobility and wheelchairs.

Sufficient seating is provided in the exhibition as well as at all video installations.

For better accessibility for people with visual impairments, the stairs in the museum and exhibition objects that could be an obstacle are marked with high contrast.

The video works themselves are subtitled in English. Accompanying scripts for the video works are available in German at the box office.

Artistic content that the curatorial team deems sensitive will have warnings.

## Event program and art education program

In addition to exhibition tours in German and English, we also offer exhibition tours in plain language in German and English, audiodescriptive guided tours and guided tours with a sign language translation. ## Existing barriers

The exhibition rooms of the museum are neither accessible nor passable without steps, but they are all connected via elevator, so that access to each level is possible for people with limited mobility and wheelchairs.

The Migros Museum für Gegenwartskunst currently has neither a floor guidance system nor floor indicators for people with visual impairments. Steps and possible obstacles in the museum are issued by high-contrast markings.

The Migros Museum für Gegenwartskunst does not currently have the technical facilities for a hearing system or induction loop for people with hearing impairments. Most of the video works in the exhibition are subtitled including closed captioning. There are no large label texts in the exhibition itself and the labels are not hung at wheelchair accessible heights. For alternative options, see „Arrival at the Migros Museum für Gegenwartskunst and information about current exhibitions“.

Currently, the elevator is not equipped with Braille panels and stops are not announced. The visitor service will be happy to accompany and assist you in reaching the respective level.
